Port Report



Infrastructure Groundbreaking

A contractor will soon break ground on a new street "NE Columbia Gorge Way" near the rock quarry in the Port's Business Park. Summit Engineering from Dallesport, Washington was selected as the low bidder of six companies to perform the work. The construction will take three months. The new infrastructure will serve five vacant lots, making them shovel-ready for jobs. The community will be invited to a groundbreaking ceremony, date TBD.

Port Acquires New Property

The Port has signed a Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) with Hood River County, to acquire 2.25 acres of property along Wa Na Pa Street, east of the new fire hall in Cascade Locks. In order to prepare the property for business development, the County has cleared the overgrown brush. The Port will contract a Phase 1 environmental study and an appraisal. The property will also need to be rezoned, as it is currently zoned P – public because previous plans called for a county-owned health clinic that is not moving forward. There are currently no confirmed plans for this property. In order to facilitate business development, the Port will market the property for one year, at which time the sale agreement will take effect.


