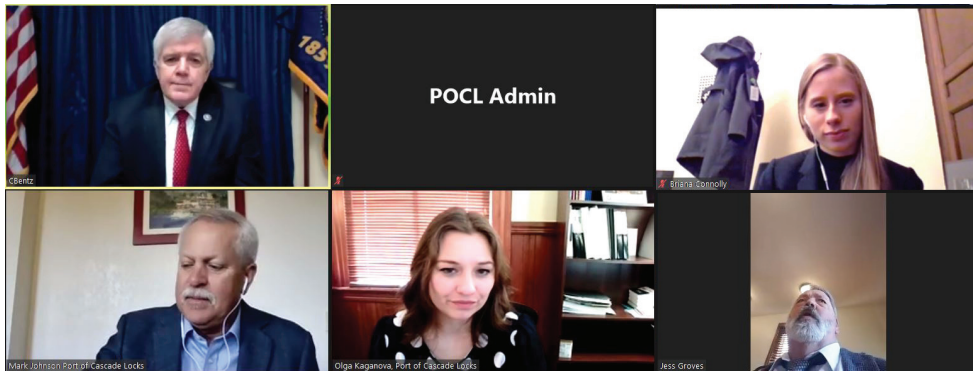

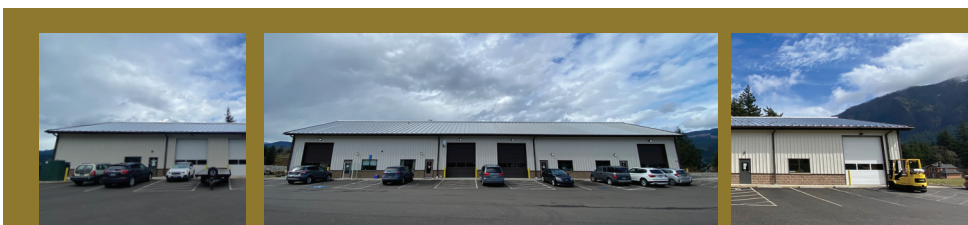


SPRING BRIDGE WELDING

The Spring Bridge Deck welding is scheduled for April 5th through 8th and the following week April 12th through 14th from 8:00am and 4:00pm. Single lane closures with flaggers directing traffic will be present on the bridge. Please plan routes accordingly. We appreciate slower speeds for the safety of our crews. Welding on the deck occurs twice a year as preventative maintenance measures and helps prolong the life of the deck. The Port has seen significant improvements since implementing this program several years ago.

PNWA MISSION TO DC RECAP

What is normally a busy week of rushing between meetings and all over our Nation’s Capitol for a select delegation from the Port of Cascade Locks, this year’s PNWA Mission DC proved to be familiar, yet completely different as well. The conference included meetings with Congressional leaders set by PNWA, as well as meetings set by the Port for more Cascade Locks focused priorities. This year’s event was still packed with meetings, 37 total meetings over the 4 day conference! Delegates from PNWA were able to ask direct questions to Senators and Representatives on transportation, navigation, energy, economic development and more. The message was consistently – federal legislature is working on COVID relief fund and the infrastructure bill. The Port advocated for exemption from Title 23 (this prevents us from accepting federal funds and continuing to use funds for economic development) and got lots of support from our congressional delegation. President Groves and Commissioner Caldwell attended the conference. Our legislators really appreciate hearing from elected officials.



LIGHT INDUSTRIAL SPACE AVAILABLE SOON

With the expected completion of the Port’s Flex 6 building this summer, several light industrial spaces in the Herman Creek Business Complex will be available to lease. These spaces, now occupied by The Renewal Workshop, are expected to be ready to lease in August. Flex Building 1 can be leased as a whole 10,000 SQ FT building, or divided into individual spaces. HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHT

Fashion in Cascade Locks looked different in the 19th century. Women wore many layers of undergarments, corsets, petticoats, and long dresses and coats. Men wore long underwear, long pants, shirts with extra cuffs and collars, and coats. Young children's clothing was unisex. Most outer clothing had elaborate embroidery and stitching, even for day-to-day wear. Don't miss the new 19th Century Fashion exhibit at the Cascade Locks Historical Museum, now open Thursdays through Mondays, 11:00 to 4:00. Closed Tuesdays and Wednesdays.
